

## **MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING**

This Memorandum of Understanding ("**MOU**") is entered into by and between:

Social Responsive Cell, Parul University located in Limda, Ta: Waghodia, Dist: Vadodara, Gujarat State is a Private University established under Gujarat Private Universities Act, 2009.

**And**

Don Bosco Snehalaya – A home for the young at Risk & A home away from home – runs by "Jagruti Samaj Sewa Mandal Trust". It is a social and Charitable Trust, registered under the law of Govt of India and Gujarat. (Reg. No. E /4860/ Vadodara, BPT Act – 1950 (29) and recognized by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment of Govt. of Gujarat (Reg. No. DSD/CPD/14-15/58). It works since 2001 for the Holistic Development and Rehabilitation of the children, who are in need of care and protection.

### **WHEREAS:**

The purpose of this MOU is to define the roles and responsibilities of both institutions to start an education centre for children who are residing at "Kaali Das ni Chali", slum area near to Vishwamitri.

Killoi Vidyamandir – an education centre will function in a house with seating capacity of 50 children and basic facilities. A qualified teacher (graduate or TTC with experience of teaching) and a helper will manage the centre. A full-fledged time table will chart out for the children spanning for a period of two hours, for five days a week.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, in view of the above, the Parties agree as follows:

- Social Responsible Cell, Parul University shall provide financial help for one year as per the budget. The term of this project shall start from 1st March. 2022 and end on 28th Feb, 2023.
- The centre shall operate five days a week, Monday to Friday, from 5.30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. The centre will be closed on holidays and also in case the staff is on leave / not available.
- The teacher will also report to the Child Friendly Vadodara – project team and update monthly progress report of all children.
- The project will be monitored continuously throughout the tenure. It will also involve monthly review and visit by SRC team to the project site.



- Don Bosco Snehalaya is fully responsible to execute street school project (Killol Vidhyamandir) at Kalidas Ni Chali in a proper way.
- Both the parties shall appoint a person for point of contact - Ms. Sreekala P.R. (from Don Bosco Snehalaya) and Mr. Vinod Parmar (Social Responsive Cell, Parul University) to deal with administrative works and project monitoring.
- The use of logo by both the parties would be done by intimating the same by each other. Both the parties shall maintain confidentiality regarding information/ documents during course of MOU.
- MOU would be terminated with prior notice to Don bosco Snehalaya.
- The project will be reviewed after one year then will be decided to be extended or not.
- Total cost of the project shall be given in different installments to Don Bosco Senhalaya by Social Responsive Cell, Parul University
- All notices and other communications shall be sent to the address of each party set forth below:

- Any dispute or difference between the parties out of or in connection with this MOU including the validity thereof shall at first instance be resolved amicably through negotiations or discussions between the Parties.
- If the dispute remains unresolved, then the same shall be taken up by the Heads of both the parties and their duly authorized representatives; who shall strive to resolve the dispute amicably.

Both Parties agree and acknowledge the aforesaid terms and conditions of the MOU.

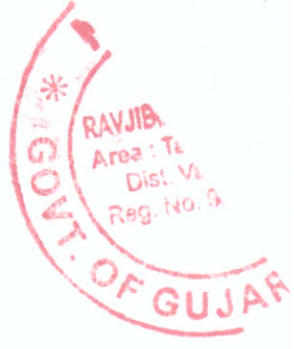

### 2.2 Responsibilities of PIPH

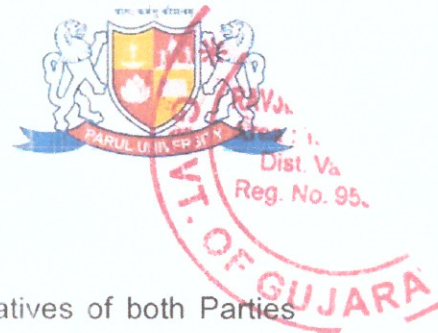
1. Submit a project proposal including budget estimates in consultation with HEPS-Uganda.
2. Invite resource persons from HEPS-Uganda in relevant educational seminar/webinar, student's orientation programs or workshops.
3. Brainstorm research ideas and prepare research proposal for submission to various funding agencies.
4. Carry out joint publications of scientific articles, reports or books.
5. Archive the research study and primary data.

### 3. TERMS



This MoU becomes effective from the day the representatives of both Parties affix their signatures below, and will continue for an initial period of five (5) years, whereupon it will be reviewed and may be extended by mutual written agreement of both Parties. This MoU may be amended through the mutual agreement of both parties. This MoU may be terminated by either party upon providing three (3) months prior written notice signed by an authorized representative of the notifying Party.

1. The development and implementation of specific activities based on this MoU will be separately negotiated and agreed between both the Parties.
2. Both Parties agree that prior written approval is required before using the other Party's name, logo, or other Intellectual Property rights in any advertising or associated publicity.
3. The terms with respect to title to and exploitation of intellectual property (including trademarks and service marks, copyrights, patents designs and confidential information on the subject of such intellectual property, inventions and innovations) will be negotiated on a project-by-project basis in the specific Implementation Agreements between both Parties.
4. This MoU may only be amended or modified by a written agreement signed by the representatives of each Party.
5. The Parties may disclose certain confidential or proprietary information to the other Party from time to time (hereinafter "Confidential Information"). Each Party therefore agrees that the contents of this MoU and such Confidential Information remain strictly confidential and each Party hereby undertakes not to disclose the same to any third Party, save for its professional advisers, without the prior written consent of the other Party except where such disclosure is required by law (including 'without limitation' under applicable freedom of information legislation).





6. Each Party (Indemnifying Party) agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the other Party (Indemnified Party) from and against any and all damages that the other Party (Indemnified Party) may suffer from or incur and that arise or result primarily from any gross negligence, willful misconduct or breach by the Party (Indemnifying Party) of its obligations, representations, agreements, or terms of this MOU.

## 6. ARBITRATION

In case there is a dispute in the implementation of this agreement, the dispute shall be resolved amicably by the two parties by mutual consent. However, if the dispute needs legal redressal, the court has jurisdiction in Vadodara, Gujarat.

## 7. GENERAL

This MoU is an expression of good will and a statement of good intentions between both Parties. It is designed to facilitate and develop a genuine and mutually beneficial exchange/research relationship between the two institutions. Revisions to the MoU and subsequent Implementation Agreements may be made upon mutual written consent of both.

**Orange Tree Foundation** (here after called as 'OTF') is a Not-for-profit Company registered under the Ministry of Corporate Affairs (MCA) having its registered office at C/O Anil Kachhwaha, Bager Chowk, Ram Dwara Street, Inside Nagori Gate, Jodhpur, Rajasthan (342006) hereinafter referred to as 'OTF' which shall where the context so admits include its successors and permitted assigns), of the FIRST part.

And

**Parul Institute for Public Health, Parul University** (here after called as PIPH-PU), a leading Institute, having its registered office at Limda, Taluka Waghodia, Vadodara, Gujarat India – 391760 hereinafter referred to as "PIPH, PU" which expression shall where the context so admits include its successors and permitted assigns), of the SECOND part,

Whereas both the parties have agreed to work collaboratively to identify and address public health issues of a vulnerable population, engage in joint research or project implementation, joint academic activities and exchange resources in the area of public health education, research, training and advocacy. The said Project shall be on a non-commercial basis.

### I – PREAMBLE

- WHEREAS** the vision of OTF strives to be an institution of excellence in life skill development that continually responds to changing social realities through the development and application of knowledge throughout the country and the world, by means of rigorous field work, evidence-based research and encourage community participation. OTF has shown keen interest to undertake research on topics which are of interest to PARUL INSTITUTE OF PUBLIC HEALTH. It will be of benefit to both the parties to work together and carry out research initiatives in the chosen common fields of interest.





OTF's mission is as follows:

- 1.1. Undertake and support interventions for well-being, economic growth, and social transformation of the disadvantaged/ vulnerable communities.
  - 1.2. Organize and facilitate activities to raise awareness, educate and build capacities of members, communities, individuals, and others on development.
  - 1.3. Undertake activities in sectors of environment, livelihoods, gender, education, children, young people, women empowerment, health, community development, promote art, culture, and others as per the needs of the communities.
  - 1.4. Collaborate with voluntary organizations, research institutes, think tanks, community-based organizations, FPOs, government and others for implementation, research, and other activities related to development challenges.
2. **WHEREAS**, PIPH-PU's, mandate is to strengthen the overall health system in the country through education, training, research, and advocacy/policy initiatives. PIPH-PU aspires to be the leading research institute pioneering in-depth scientific research and understanding of the impact and mechanism of action of Explanation of app and other products.

## II – SCOPE

The two institutions (FIRST and SECOND Parties) have decided to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding to jointly work to follow with following objectives:

1. Jointly carry out research in public health area and publish research papers in reputed peer reviewed journals.
2. Sharing of resources, expertise and facilities.
3. Staging joint seminars, conferences and academic meetings.
4. Collaboration in any other areas of mutual interest.
5. Collaboration and training of resources for contributing to research

## III – DURATION OF MOU

The MoU shall remain in force for a period of five years from the date of its signature and seal by both the parties and may be terminated by either side by giving a three-month notice to that effect in writing. The Parties to this Memorandum may, by mutual consent, add, modify, amend, delete, review or revise any term(s) and conditions of this agreement at any point of time. #### IV - FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENT

This document, as such, doesn't contain any financial implications. However, if anything arises in future it will be undertaken by separate financial terms & conditions on a project-to-project basis and mutual consensus.

#### V - RIGHTS, OBLIGATIONS ETC OF THE PARTIES UNDER THIS MOU.

- a) The rights, interest, title, claim, obligation etc of the Parties to this MOU shall be strictly restricted to the express terms and condition specified in this MOU.
- b) Parties shall not rely upon conditions, terms, circumstances, reasons or excuses not specified in this MOU, to avoid or evade their obligation/s. All the Parties hereby assure and promise each other that they have not concealed any information, facts, which they may rely upon in future from this MOU.
- c) Force majeure: Neither Party shall be held responsible for non-fulfilment of their respective obligations under this MoU due to the exigency of one or more of the force majeure events such as but not limited to acts of God, War, Flood, Earthquake, Strikes, lockouts, Epidemics, Riots, Civil Commotions, etc., provided on the occurrence and cessation of any such event, the affected party thereby shall give a notice in writing to the other party within one month of such occurrence or cessation. If the force majeure conditions continue beyond six (6) months, the parties shall jointly decide about the future course of action.

#### VI - This MOU is agreed on the below mentioned terms and conditions: -

##### Article 1: Fields of Collaboration

1.1. OTF and PIPH-PU may collaborate within any mutually agreeable field of research and education.

##### Article 2: Exchange of Faculty and Research Scholars

2.1 OTF and PIPH-PU will encourage collaboration in research and education in areas of mutual interest, through reciprocal arrangements for faculty/staff and research scholar exchanges.

2.2 As feasible, and contingent upon cognizant parent organization or departmental approval, the administrations of the two institutions agree to assist their respective faculty members/staff members in developing scholarly exchanges that may include a range of interactions such as research collaboration, specialized lectures, seminars and teaching or submission of joint research proposals.





### **Article 3: Research projects**

3.1 Interested faculty/staff of either institution may initiate joint research projects. Subject to available funding, the Parties will encourage research centres of their respective institutions to initiate and conduct collaborative projects consistent with the other terms and specifications of this agreement. Such joint research projects are to be the subject of definitive project proposal specific to each research study / project.

3.2 The financial arrangement relating to each joint research project will be in accordance with the specific Research Proposal covering each such study / project.

### **Article 4: Intellectual Property, Inventions and Innovations**

4.1 The terms with respect to title to and exploitation of intellectual property (including trademarks and service marks, copyrights, patents designs and confidential information on the subject of such intellectual property, inventions and innovations) will be negotiated on a project-by-project basis in the specific research project agreements referred to in Article-3 and broadly governed by the IPR policy of both institutions.

4.2 Information on research results and scientific materials (reports, articles, books) will be exchanged freely keeping in mind the mutually agreed provision of Intellectual Property Rights.

4.3 All Intellectual Property solely conceived and/or developed by OTF during the course of this Agreement shall be owned by OTF. All Intellectual Property solely conceived and/or developed by PIPH-PU during the course of this collaboration which shall be owned by PIPH-PU. Intellectual Property jointly conceived and/or developed by OTF and PIPH-PU will be jointly owned by OTF and PIPH-PU.

4.4. For purposes of Research Project and on its completion of the Research Study / Project, such completed Project shall be termed as "Intellectual Property" which shall on completion and approval of the Project will mean any and all works and property including, but not limited to, all intellectual properties, ideas, inventions, concepts, products, improvements, innovations, discoveries, developments, methods, formulas, techniques, software, know-how and writings made, conceived, reduced to practice, developed, written, or prepared by a party, whether or not patentable or copyrightable and whether made solely by that party or jointly with other third parties.

### **Article 5: Administration and General Provisions**

5.1 This MoU shall have an initial duration of five years from the date of signature, unless either party gives a three-month notice of termination. This MoU may be extended further, in one-year increments, by mutual written agreement, subject to availability of funds.





5.2 Despite the statements and obligations expressed herein, this MoU is a non-binding expression of the current intentions of the Parties, and neither Party will incur nor be bound to any legal obligations or expense hereunder to the other Party until and unless definitive agreements have been negotiated, approved by the necessary management levels of each Party and executed and delivered by authorized representatives of both Parties.

5.3 This MoU is signed subject to approval by the appropriate authorities on both sides.

4. Publish research studies in collaboration with PIPH-PU
5. Organize educational seminar/workshop at OTF.
6. Engage PIPH-PU students and offer an internship at OTF.

## VIII - RESPONSIBILITIES OF PIPH-PU

1. Provide technical support in designing, planning, monitoring and evaluating research or project.
2. Submit a project proposal plan and design every research project prior to commencement of research process activities, including budget estimates along with OTF.
3. Write joint research or project implementation proposals for external grants from an institution such as ICMR, ICSSR, DST Wellcome Trust, etc.
4. Organize and celebrate health promotion events, conferences, seminars in collaboration with OTF.
5. Exchange scientific information, intellectual property, articles and publications.

## IX - ETHICAL GUIDELINES

Both parties agree to follow the ethical guidelines laid down for research, by various regulatory agencies and protect the interest, dignity and confidentiality of all the participants including the vulnerable population like children, women etc. Both parties agree to present themselves for review by Institutional Ethics Committee at regular intervals.

## X – CONFIDENTIALITY

The parties shall keep the project related data and information related to participants strictly confidential and shall not share the same with any unauthorized entity.





## **XI - COORDINATION OF PROJECTS**

Once a research project is finalized, OTF and PIPH-PU shall jointly work out the modalities of overall coordination. OTF and PIPH-PU will nominate a research associate on their behalf who will be responsible for day-to-day communication.

## **XII - NON-DISCLOSURE**

No party will disclose any investigations/outcome of research study to media/any unauthorized person from each institutes/any other agency in any form, whether electronic/print/audio visual/interviews to press etc without mutual consent.

## **XIII – JURISDICTION**

Any dispute shall be subject to jurisdiction at Vadodara, Gujarat.

## **XIV – AMENDMENTS TO MoU**

Amendments to this MoU can be made with consent of both the parties.

## **XV – TERMINATION OF MoU**

1. This MoU may be terminated by either of the parties forthwith if the any other party commits breach of any of the terms hereof and shall have failed to rectify such breach within ninety (90) days of the notice in this behalf having been served on it by the other party.
2. In addition to the reasons for termination as set forth above, this MoU may be terminated forthwith if either of the parties voluntarily or involuntarily enters into composition, bankruptcy or similar re-organization proceedings or if applications invoking such proceedings have been filed.

## **XVI – NOTICES**

All notices and other communications required to be served on OTF and PIPH, PU under the terms of this MoU, shall be considered duly served if the same shall have been delivered to, left with or posted by registered mail to the party at its last known address of business.

## **XVII – ARBITRATION**

In case there is a dispute in the implementation of this agreement, the dispute shall be resolved amicably by the two parties by mutual consent. However, if the dispute needs legal redressal, the court has jurisdiction in Vadodara, Gujarat.

- iii. Acharan Welfare Foundation will be responsible for the complete operations (i.e. Operational Staff, HR, Staff Renumerations, Waste Disposal, Transportation & other allied services); and they need to adhere the campus protocols & norms issued by the Parul University Management.
- iv. Acharan Welfare Foundation will charge Rs, 1,50,000 INR as monthly complete project execution charges for above mentioned work and operations from Parul University; and Acharan welfare foundation will also generate the revenue by selling segregated dry waste to the market. **Income generated by waste segregation and waste material trading will be used to uplift the livelihood of ragpickers and ground staff.**
- v. Acharan Welfare Foundation will provide one bailing machine for the compress waste and Reduce space for the storage.

#### **Deliverables by Parul University:**

- i. Parul University will allow Acharan Welfare Foundation to collect, segregate and manage the waste at Parul University - Vadodara Campus.



- ii. Parul University will provide a space to manage the waste management operations at campus to Acharan welfare foundation.

Being heavily dependent on agriculture, livelihood in rural areas could not provide employment for everyone. In the absence of significant industrial growth, there has been severe unemployment and underemployment, resulting in poverty. For most of the poor, fight for survival has been a lifelong mission and natural resources have been the main source of livelihood.

During this long struggle, women have suffered the most. They have to cope up with day-to-day basic needs such as fetching water, collecting fodder and fuel, grinding foodgrains and nursing their children and sick, apart from attending to livestock and agriculture chores.

Women are the backbone of rural and national economies. They represent 49% of the total workforce. In spite of their significant role in supporting the family, women in many regions have no status in the society. They are treated as idle, despite their work schedule stretching throughout the day. They are not expected to participate in decision making and even to express their opinion on matters concerning themselves.

The similar situation prevails in the waghodia block close to the organisation's location. Though the villages are close to urban setup and have influence of urbanisation but still deep rooted with orthodox mentality. Based on this situation Social Responsive Cell (SRC) of Parul University has started its THELLY project in 2020. The project targets to improve the situation of the women by providing them income generation opportunities at their doorsteps.

Theli is a Gujarati word commonly used for carry bag. A usage of bags is one of the major steps towards plastic free spaces and hence this project generates products and brings awareness in rural area. The aim of 'Thelly' project is to start a social enterprise with this innovation to empower the women by enabling mass production of cloth bags also promote plastic free villages/spaces/Environment.

We have started with 50 skilled women from the Madheli village who know stitching work and having sewing machine. Based on success now we have set-up women livelihood centre, where all skilled women shall be invited for the stitching of all type of cloth material based bags.

As Apollo Tyres Foundation also has similar livelihood generation programme in same vicinity with same beneficiaries hence, we approached them for collaborative partnership for this project.

**Article 1: Fields of Collaboration**

## **Article 2: Exchange of Faculty and Research Scholars**

**2.1** Baroda Children Eye Care and Squint Clinic and DPHS will encourage collaboration in research and education in areas of mutual interest, through reciprocal arrangements for faculty and research scholar exchanges.

**2.1.1** As feasible, and contingent upon cognizant parent organization or departmental approval, the administrations of the two institutions agree to assist their respective faculty members in developing scholarly exchanges that may include a range of interactions such as research collaboration, specialized lectures, conferences, seminars and teaching or submission of joint research proposals.

**2.1.2** Both parties must agree upon the specific terms of any inter-institution initiative relative to this agreement in written or electronically recorded correspondence at least one month prior to the initiation of a particular program or activity in order for the said initiative to proceed.

**2.1.3** Each host institution, in the pre-visit agreement correspondence, will also coordinate support with the visiting institution for office space, library, laboratory and other privileges appropriate to the level and purpose of the visit, subject to the availability of resources.

## **Article 3: Research projects**

**3.1** Interested faculty of either institution may initiate joint research projects. Subject to available funding, the Parties will encourage research centres of their respective institutions to initiate and conduct collaborative projects consistent with the other terms and specifications of this agreement. Such joint research projects are to be the subject of definitive project agreements specific to each project and separate from this MoU.

**3.2** The financial arrangement relating to each joint research project will be in accordance with the specific agreement covering each project.

## **Article 4: Intellectual Property, Inventions and Innovations**

The terms with respect to title to and exploitation of intellectual property (including trademarks and service marks, copyrights, patents designs and confidential information on the subject of such intellectual property, inventions and innovations) will be negotiated on a project-by-project basis in the specific research project agreements referred to in Article-3 and broadly governed by the IPR policy of both institutions. Information on research results and





scientific materials (reports, articles, books) will be exchanged freely keeping in mind the mutually agreed provision of Intellectual Property Rights. All Intellectual Property solely conceived and/or developed by Baroda Children Eye Care and Squint Clinic, during the course of this agreement shall be owned by Baroda Children Eye Care and Squint Clinic. All Intellectual Property solely conceived and/or developed by DPHS during the course of this Agreement shall be owned by DPHS. Intellectual Property jointly conceived and/or developed by Baroda Children Eye Care and Squint Clinic and DPHS will be jointly owned by Baroda Children Eye Care and Squint Clinic, (Baroda) and DPHS. For purposes of this Agreement, the term "Intellectual Property" shall mean any and all works and property including, but not limited to, all intellectual properties, ideas, inventions, concepts, products, improvements, innovations, discoveries, developments, methods, formulas, techniques, software, know- how and writings made, conceived, reduced to practice, developed, written, or prepared by a party, whether or not patentable or copyrightable and whether made solely by that party or jointly with other third parties. Baroda Children Eye Care and Squint Clinic, (Baroda) and DPHS agree to collaborate towards the protection, if appropriate, and application of such Intellectual Property for commercial or other purposes on mutually acceptable terms to be negotiated in good faith between the parties.

#### **Article 5: Training and Placement**

- 5.1.1 Department of Paramedical & Health Sciences can place their Optometry students in the group hospitals located in Vadodara City i.e. Baroda Children Eye Care and Squint Clinic
- 5.1.2 Department of Paramedical & Health Sciences has got competent staff and who will help the students to their best capabilities during their training.
- 5.1.3 All basic facilities will be provided to students for their clinical teaching.
- 5.1.4 Scope of Baroda Children Eye Care and Squint Clinic would be of providing observership & training to the students
- 5.1.5 Two organizations would exchange information and data on training and skills.
- 5.1.6 Baroda Children Eye Care and Squint Clinic will require the prior intimation from Department of Paramedical & Health Sciences regarding the schedule of the students to be placed for training.
- 5.1.7 The students will have to follow the instruction given by Directors of Baroda Children Eye Care and Squint Clinic and abide with the rules and regulations of the hospital.

- 5.1.8 The institute may provide the final year students for the job placement at Baroda Children Eye Care and Squint Clinic if there is vacancy in the institute.
- 5.1.9 Student will not be allowed to enter in restricted areas without permission of competent authority.
- 5.1.10 Students will strictly follow the rules, regulation, safety protocols of Baroda Children Eye Care and Squint Clinic.
- 5.1.11 Students under impression of any prohibited material (like alcohol, tobacco, smoking, and drug) will not be allowed to enter in the hospital premises.
- 5.1.12 All students will be responsible for their personal belongings, vehicles parked in parking; cash, hospital will not be responsible for any theft or misplacement of such items.
- 5.1.13 During the training / Observer ship if any equipment, property, fixed assets, is damaged it will be recovered from the student.

#### **Article 6: Administration and General Provisions**

6.1 This MoU shall have an initial duration of five years from the date of signature, unless either party gives a six-month notice of termination. This MoU may be extended further, in five-year increments, by mutual written agreement

6.2 Despite the statements and obligations expressed herein, this MoU is a non-binding expression of the current intentions of the Parties, and neither Party will incur nor be bound to any legal obligations or expense hereunder to the other Party until and unless definitive agreements have been negotiated, approved by the necessary management levels of each Party and executed and delivered by authorized representatives of both Parties.

This MoU is signed subject to approval by the appropriate authorities on both sides.

#### **7. Termination**

7.1 Either party may terminate this MoU by mutual understanding by giving 3 (three) months' notice in writing served on other.

7.2 The parties to the MoU understand that, where a course, as aforesaid, is under continuance, the termination shall take effect only on completion of the subsisting course.
